Don't we deserve better protection and services for our families and homes? We are hard working tax payers! Are we the little towns that everyone has forgotten about? Making our towns the perfect places for drug dealers and sexual predators who don't want to attract attention to themselves! We have been told that the police don't have the manpower or resources to put more patrol cars in our area. Just like everything else in life, it comes down to money. As a citizen you can help! Look for the petition around town, requesting more police protection on our streets and SIGN IT! Nothing will get done unless we raise all of our little voices into one LOUD voice. The louder the wheel squeaks, the quicker it gets fixed! We want our towns to be safe places for our families again! Please join us and make your voice heard.

Futhermore, to anyone who doesn't think we need more Patrol Cars in our Community, we ask you to review the statistics from March 2004 through March 2008. The Number ONE worst area (According to Call Logs) is around the 600 block of Jackson in Bacliff with 2,852 call outs. The Number TWO worst area (According to Call Logs) is around the 400 block of 8th and 9th Street in San Leon with 1,112 call outs. With 135 calls coming from the mobile home park on 9th Street in San Leon. These areas are only a small part of our community (San Leon, Bacliff, and Bayview). How can ONE patrol car be expected to keep up with the sheer volume of calls each day? Instead of blaming the police for never being there when you may need them, try understanding that they need our help. We can start helping by signing the petition around town to put more patrol cars on our streets!
